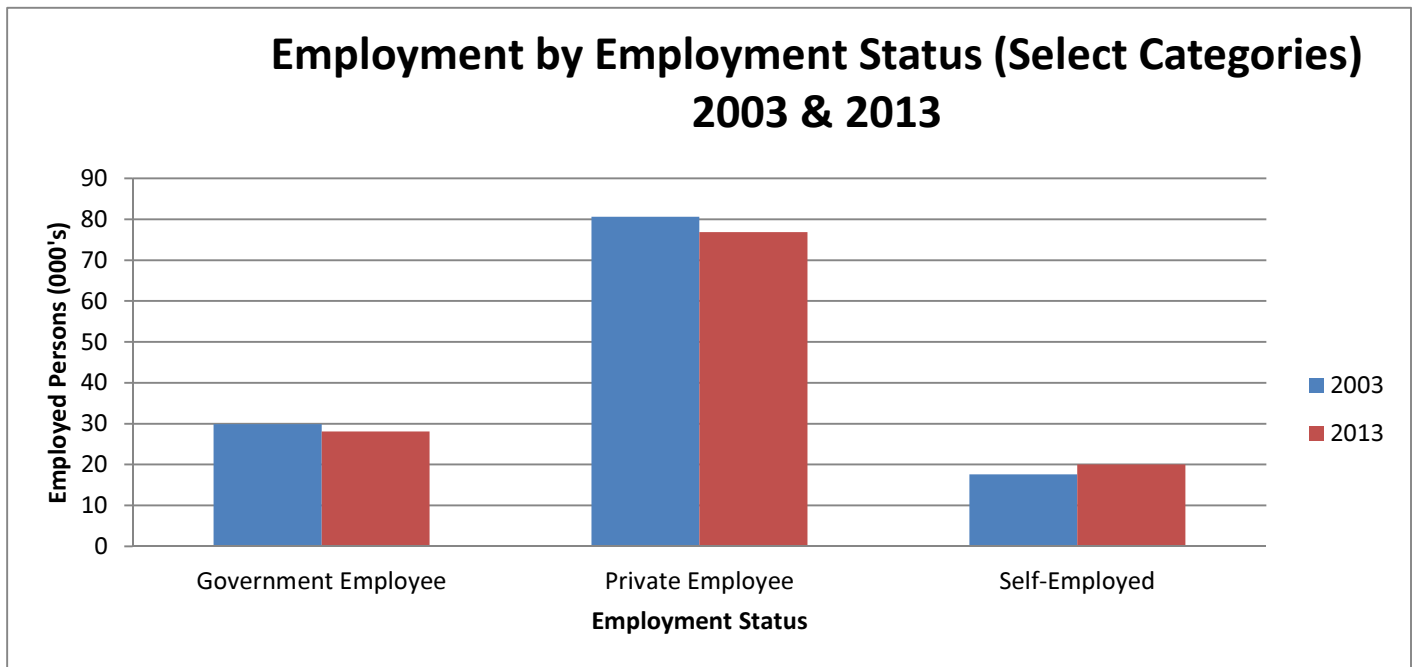


**Employment by Employment Status (000's)**

This section dissects the employed labour force into employment status categories such as employer, self-employed, private employee, government employee, etc. The bar chart above shows the numbers employed in the three largest employment status categories. These are (i) Private Employees (ii) Government Employees and (iii) Self-Employed. As at 2013, these categories comprised 61%, 22% and 16% of the total employed labour force respectively.

In making a point-to-point comparison over the ten year period, private employees (persons working for a wage or salary in a non-government undertaking) declined by 3,700 persons, whilst the self-employed category grew by 2,400 persons. The number of Government employees (inclusive of workers at statutory corporations) recorded a decrease of around 1,800 workers over the ten year period.
