What you should never do

- ❖ Never mix bleach with any chemicals such as drain or toilet cleaners because toxic fumes will result.
- Chemicals may be toxic, flammable or may react violently when mixed.
- Never eat while spraying or dusting with chemicals.
- Never put chemicals into soft drink bottles or containers that are generally recognized as food containers.
- Do not remove products from the original containers for storage or future use.

What you should do

- Make sure all products are clearly labelled and tightly sealed.
- Read labels before use, storage and handling and follow instructions given.
- Use recommended personal protective equipment, such as gloves and safety goggles.
- ❖ Follow first aid instructions if the chemical gets on the skin or in the eyes, swallowed, or fumes inhaled, seek medical attention if necessary.
- ❖ Compare labels and product contents when buying chemicals, always choose the less toxic option.

Let's Go Green

- ❖ Salt and vinegar can clean kitchen taps.
- ❖ Cut grime with full strength white distilled vinegar.
- Remove stains from teacups by scrubbing them with equal parts of baking soda and vinegar.
- Discourage ants by spraying undiluted vinegar outside window sills and counter tops.
- ❖ Deodorise the toilet by allowing 3 cups white vinegar to sit in the bowl for half an hour before flushing.
- Clean and deodorise blocked drains with one cup baking soda and one cup white distilled vinegar. Sit for five minutes then pour hot water down the drain.
- * Remove soap scum with one part salt to four parts vinegar.
- ❖ Kill germs all around the bathroom with a spray of full strength vinegar. Wipe clean with a damp cloth.
- Sprinkling baking soda in the bottom of garbage bags will help to control odours as you add trash.
- Wipe grease off exhaust fans and grills with a sponge soaked in vinegar.
