Role of Building Standards Authority

- Enforce provisions of the Barbados National Building Code
 - Building Act
- Enforcement relates to the:
 - erection (new construction)
 - extension
 - alteration or
 - change of use
- of a building

Overlapping Interests of BSA and H &S

- Overlapping Interests concern:
 - means of escape and warning of fire in buildings
 - (sections 32-42 of H&S Act (Part 4 of B.C)
 - provision of handrails and barriers to prevent falling
 - (sections 43 & 44 of H&S Act, Part 8 of B.C)
 - ventilation of buildings
 - > (section 52 of H&S Act, Part 6 of B.C)

Overlapping Interests of BSA and H &S

- provision of sanitary facilities
 - (section 65, Part 10 of B.C)
- overlapping interests do not conflict.
- Building regulations require:
 - protective works to building sites
 - clearing of footpaths and roads adjoining building sites
 - securing unoccupied buildings to the satisfaction of the BSA

Relationship with Health and Safety (H&S)

- BSA to inform H& S weekly on applications received
- H&S can inspect applications at BSA office
- H &S to inform applicant of any objections
- H & S to send copy of any objections to BSA
